outside roof and is quite impressive (This is where all publicity photos are taken). Vehicle identification and some history is on the signage for most cars. Upon exiting the 1st floor on the side downward ramps, the aesthetics change to a very bland white walls with minimal if any signage and history on vehicles, and this carries through the rest of the 3 floors. The downward



walk ramps display many import brands of cars and motorcycles (of which there are many) and have some historic and creatively constructed photo collages as backdrops.

The Hershey, Pennsylvania AACA Fall show is the place to see things you don't see anywhere else. This year, parked within sight of my space was this 1931 Ford "Deluxe" pickup. A joint marketing idea between Henry Ford and General Electric, that never caught on. Briggs ceased production of the bodies at 293. Stainless grab/load bars, with stainless rear hinges and hasps patterned after the thick metal stainless hardware on the new GE "roundtop" refrigerators.

Today, when I occasionally drive down this gravel road in Sumpter Township, MI., past a certain dilapidated farmhouse, I think of the one I left behind for \$250 way back when. At the time I marveled at someone's ability to custom craft such a nice "flower car" for the trade, and too bad it was brush painted white. Not the only one that got away!

Brian's Mini-Tip: The Hornies

Did you know that most horns are in the key of F sharp? Did you ever have your twin horned car horns make some namsy-pansy squeaks when you press the horn button? Then you unhook one to find out which one is the problem to find one works great, so you do the other to find it works great too? Sometimes the two of them draw more current than the vehicle's system can provide, one horn at a time being alright, but both together being just too much. This is not an uncommon problem that can sometimes be corrected by adjusting the horns. Horns usually have an external adjusting screw that can be turned slightly in or out until the horns work properly. A small turn, a quarter turn at a time, is all that should be necessary, and a horn can be damaged by turning the screw in too far. Having someone hold the horn button down while you make the adjustments to hear the sound change seems to work best, and it's no doubt the best of all ways to annoy your neighbors too.
